

A side effect from your medicine?

If you think a medicine from your doctor or pharmacist has caused an unwanted side effect (an adverse drug reaction), please report the problem to the Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency on a Yellow Card.

We welcome reports on any suspected side effect, especially side effects not mentioned in the patient information leaflet you received or side effects that interfered with everyday activities.

Sometimes it's difficult to tell if the medicine caused the effect, but even if you are not sure whether a medicine caused a side effect we'd like your report.

Helping to make medicines safer

Medicines are designed to prevent or treat illnesses, or relieve symptoms. Any medicine can cause side effects. Side effects may not be discovered until many people have used the medicine over a period of time. Side effects can occasionally appear after a person has stopped taking a medicine.

You can help to make medicines safer for everyone by filling in a Yellow Card about a suspected side effect.

You can send a Yellow Card report about a suspected side effect experienced by:

- you
- your child
- someone else you are responsible for

Always tell your pharmacist or doctor if you have problems with a medicine
